Fire Department Calls

The Ham Lake Fire Department responded to 30 calls during the month of May: 17 during the day and 13 at night. The department spent 244.5 personal hours responding to calls for the month. Year-to-date, the department has answered 139 calls, compared with 162 calls at the same time last year.

Do I have Oak Wilt?

Ham Lake will no longer be doing drive-by inspections from public roads for oak wilt. If you suspect oak wilt, please contact the City's Tree Inspector at 763-235-1662 and he will come out to your property and inspect your tree(s).

Oak wilt is a common fungus in Ham Lake that kills hundreds of mature oak trees annually. New infection sites occur when oaks are damaged, cut or pruned during April, May, June and July.

Look for leaves with brown edges and green centers. It can be spread by insects and through roots.

It is important to remember not to cut or prune any oak trees between April 1st and July 15th.

(Article 11.1400.4 of the City Code)

Trees that are infected with oak wilt should be removed the following winter and chipped, burned or sealed with plastic to limit the number of fungal spores available during the spring months. Infected wood should not be moved offsite as it could potentially create new infection centers.

If you need to cut an oak tree(s) during the no-cut period, you must get a permit from the City prior to cutting. Please contact the City Tree Inspector with any questions at (763) 235-1662.

May Building Permits

The City of Ham Lake issued 131 permits in May with a valuation of \$4,245,856.

The issued permits are as follows: one commercial new construction, one commercial fence, one commercial siding, three commercial sign, two residential new construction, four residential remodel, two residential basement finish, one residential addition, six residential deck, one residential porch & deck, two residential accessory building, one residential solar panels, one residential in-ground pool, and 40 roofing/siding.

Other permits include 38 mechanical, 21 plumbing and six septic installations.

Summer Brings Algae Blooms

If a pond is green and smelly, it is probably doing its job of capturing excess phosphorus. This is especially true with summer temps.

Sometimes the green is not algae but tiny plants, duckweed or watermeal that lie on the water surface. These ponds don't usually smell. These tiny plants are important food for ducks and ducklings!

How to reduce algal blooms? Reduce phosphorus.

If you fertilize you may be throwing money down.

If you fertilize, you may be throwing money down the drain:

- Use the UMN Soil Lab \$20 test: call 612-625-3101 or go online at *soiltest.cfans.umn.edu/testing-services/lawn-garden*
- Use "natural fertilizer." Leave grass clippings on your lawn as you mow. One inch in length can easily decompose. Keep clippings out of the street.

Help Prevent Poo-Ilution!

We've all been there—you're out on a walk when you suddenly have to swerve to avoid stepping in dog poo. Please help prevent this. Not only is it polite to pick up and throw away your dog's poop—it also keeps our waters clean!

Even small amounts of dog waste contain lots of E. coli bacteria and phosphorus, common water pollutants. Improperly or un-disposed waste can flow into local waterbodies from rain and snowmelt flowing into storm drains.

This is why it's important to always pick up the poop no matter where it is and throw it into trash containers. Pet waste can leach bacteria even in winter, so pick waste up year-round. Thanks for helping protect our water and your fellow walkers' shoes!

Day 4 Electric is an independent, veteran-owned electrical contractor company owned and operated by Tim Johnson.

The first question Tim gets from customers is "What does Day 4 mean?" He answers, "I will never start or run a business if it doesn't honor God. Christ did his thing in the first three days, and then on the fourth day, he left it to us to carry on the work. That's what Day 4 means."


